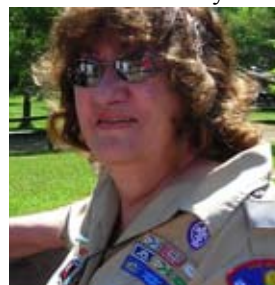

## Check updates on Youth Protection [www.skcbbsa.org](http://www.skcbbsa.org)

Youth Protection training is required for all registered volunteers. Beginning June 1, 2010 new leaders are required to take Youth Protection training before they submit an application for registration. The certificate of completion for this training must be submitted at the time application is made and before volunteer service with youth begins.

**In addition, Youth Protection training must be taken every two years. If a volunteer's Youth Protection training record is not current at the time of recharter, the volunteer will not be reregistered.**

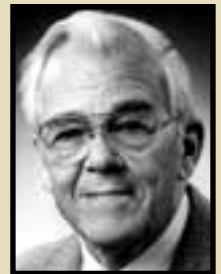

## Scouting Mourns the Loss of a Great Leader

Raymond E. Mason, Jr. known as "the General" for his military service has passed away at the age of 90. Mason was a past Council President of the Simon Kenton Council and a winner of Scouting's highest volunteer honors including the Silver beaver and Silver Antelope in addition to the Baden Powell Award from The World Scout Foundation. He was a Steadfast benefactor to the Scouting program and donated the funds to construct the Raymond E. Mason, Jr. Shooting Sports Complex at Camp Lazarus.



Mason was incredibly active in other charities throughout Central Ohio as well winning the Man of the Year award from the Rotary Club of Columbus and the Ohio State University Centennial Medallion. His legacy is seen throughout Central Ohio and his devotion to the ideals and values of Scouting were unmatched.

Mason had a distinguished military career serving under General George S. Patton in World War II and earning the Silver Star, Legion of Merit, and the Bronze Star with V for Valor before retiring as Major General. He was the founder of Columbus Truck and Equipment Co. and served as a director for several other corporations.

- 2) Finalize your unit incentive program. Learn about council incentives and trails end incentives to motivate Scouts to sell.
- 3) Build your best Popcorn kickoff ever. A kick-off event or information session can be an effective way to pump up Scouts and educate the public about the importance of the sale.
- 4) Set up a communication plan to communicate with Scouts and parents about sale goals. Update your troop using social media, e-mail, and phone trees. Measure real time sales to achieve your goal.
- 5) Achieve your sales goals! Utilize online sales from trails end to increase sales, house to house sales, office and store front sales to reach fund-raising goals.
- 6) Need ideas? Or more assistance to make your popcorn events pop? Contact your district Popcorn Kernel, or contact your council representative we are here to help.

## Popcorn Sale: Military Donation Option



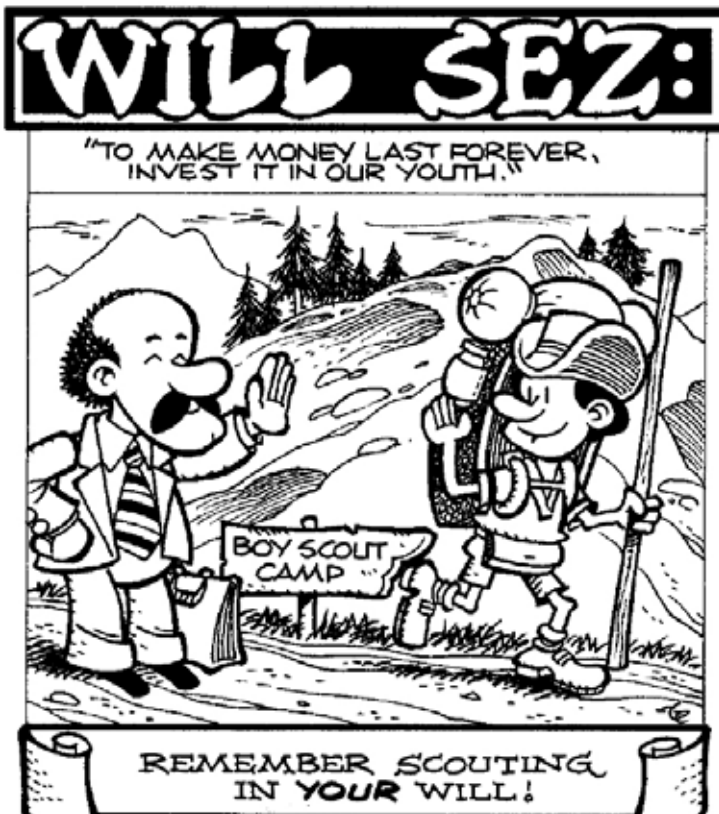

## National Outdoor Badges: Camping, Hiking, Riding, Aquatics & Adventure



The five National Outdoor Badges recognize a Boy Scout or Varsity Scout who demonstrates both knowledge and experience in camping, hiking, aquatics, riding, or adventure.

Scouts earning the National Outdoor badges have demonstrated that they are knowledgeable, safe, and comfortable in the outdoor activity covered by the badge.

Each segment is earned by completing the First Class rank, earning relevant merit badges, and accumulating experience—nights of camping, miles of hiking, hours of swimming, etc.

Once they earn a segment, boys can go the extra mile (in some cases literally) and shoot for gold or silver devices, available for spending extra time on a particular activity.

The badges and devices are impressive, but the highest honor for outdoor lovers is the National Medal for Outdoor Achievement, seen at right.
